Memories from a friend of the Show:

Many thanks for your reminder about the patriotic song written by Ralph Reader - *Wave The Flag*. In the County Archive Cabin at Well End, the County holds the sheet / album music for this and all his other London Gang Show music and for performances he held at various locations over the years, and of the Pageants he produced at The Albert Hall.

In case you did not know, Ralph visited Hertfordshire many times in his search for suitable young people to star in his shows (Freddy O'Hare and Martin Hart included). On 18 April 1949 he made his first visit to Phasels Wood Campsite where he used the piano in the Wardens bungalow to score and write some of his more famous numbers.

The first London Gang Show was in 1932 and this closed in 1974. I was fortunate to attend the final performance and took Freddy and Len Spikesley as my guests. Ralph also produced shows at the Albert Hall. The Musical Pageant / Play "*Boy Scout*" was first produced in 1936 and had several repeats until 1959. The cast of over 1000 included many Scouts from Hertfordshire at various performances. "The Boy" was often chosen from Hertfordshire and Michael Manders was "The Boy" in 1948. For many years Fred North a Hertfordshire Scouter was the Choir Steward and Bert Moreton from South West Herts District and later Warden at Well End Campsite was also a choir member. There were also several hundred people in the choir

On one of his visits to Hertfordshire in 1970 Ralph was asked to "lay" the foundation stone at the HQ of the First Abbots Langley Scout Group. The event coincided with the 100th edition of the Group Magazine, *Woodsmoke*, now the longest continuously running Group Magazine in the UK.

In 1954, Ralph attended the National Conference at Filey Holiday Camp where he received a Chief Commissioners Plume from Chief Scout Lord Rowallan.

The cast of the Gang Show were guests on the stage at Sunday Night at the London Palladium. This is possibly because Michael Hurll the Producer and his father were former Scouts. Members of the Royal Family were often in attendance.

In his later years Ralph was the organiser of the Albert Hall *Festival of Remembrance*. When Ralph died in 1982 he had produced 142 shows there, more than anyone else. He also produced a Scouting play "*Great Oaks*" at

the Golders Green Hippodrome. He was twice a guest on *Desert Island Discs* in 1954 and 1962. His luxury items were a typewriter and paper, and the book, "*Goodbye Mr Chips*". He was awarded an MBE and later a CBE in 1957.

He died on Thursday 13 May 1982 having attended a celebratory dinner for the 50th anniversary of the Gang Show two months earlier. This dinner was held as a tribute to Ralph and had 600 guests. These included former members of the Gang Show, representatives from provincial shows, wartime fellows from the RAF Gang Shows and brothers from the Grand Order of Water Rats of which Ralph was a member. The former Chief Scout Lord MacLean (then the Lord Chamberlain) and his wife Lady MacLean, Ken Stevens and many other old friends attended.

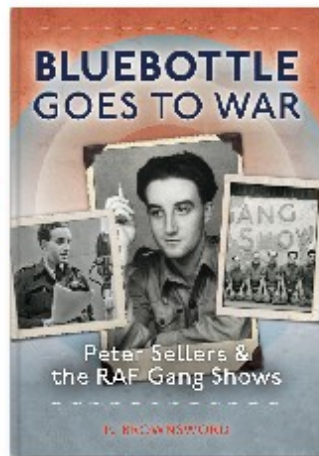
BLUEBOTTLE GOES TO WAR

Peter Sellers was one of the biggest stars of the 1960s and 70s. His career began with characters such as Bluebottle on BBC radio's *The Goon Show* and he achieved global fame as Inspector Clouseau in the *Pink Panther* series.

What is less well known is that he served in the Royal Air Force Entertainment Units (known as Gang Shows) for over three years. Now, for the first time, this story can be told, a tale of the formation and education of his remarkable talents, as well as a small corner of Second World War history that seems uniquely British (groups of servicemen and women sent around the world with hampers full of theatrical props and costumes, to rally the troops in distant outposts of Empire).

This book reveals previously unknown film footage, photos, performances, broadcasts and recordings, from the very beginning of Sellers' career.

PJ Brownsword was born in Sussex and studied music history at Oxford, with an avid interest in research for local history publications as a student and other diversions of photography, cars and cricket - these are by coincidence also listed as Sellers' hobbies in "*Who's Who*", 1967.
