

I need to make a huge apology to Bob Corp Reader as this following article was omitted from the Winter edition. I have searched through the records and realized that I probably found we had rather a lot of material in that edition. However I hope I can now rectify that omission and hope that we can all take a moment to remember Eddie Gregory as we read these lovely memories. Thank you Bob.

Eddie Gregory and "The Angel"

I was sorry to learn of the passing of Eddie as within the "Fellowship" I suppose I knew Eddie the longest. You see Eddie and I were both in the same Scout Troop, the 33rd North London during

which time I was Eddie's Senior Scout Patrol Leader. The troop met at the Emanuel Church, Hornsey Road and right opposite was Eddie's father and mothers fish and chip shop. My goodness we always received 'royal' helpings of chips after Troop meetings in those days.

In 1959 I became producer of the "Islington Gang Show" which was presented annually at the Islington Town Hall. My first Gang Show in Islington was in the cast in the 1949 show, the first after the Second World War. However, back to 1959 when I was producer and Eddie a cast member. On returning home to Hendon one night after a rehearsal, Ralph asked, "What do you intend doing for the Finale?" I replied, "Oh I suppose the normal reprieve of one or two of the numbers," pour yourself a drink he said and come and listen to this. He then played a piece of music he had composed but had not completed as yet the lyrics. At around 3 am in the morning we had completed the lyrics and the number was entitled "The Angel."

The following week I asked Eddie if he would like to lead the number in the Finale and he jumped at the idea. Not only did Ralph give the number to Islington but allowed us to have it printed, and sell, sheet music of it. Someone I knew who had a printing company did the printing, some of you may remember him, Mick Barker, a long serving committee member of the London Gang. "The Angel" became not only the Islington Gangs 'National Anthem' but Eddie's own! When Ralph saw that 1959 show he invited Eddie to join the London Gang of which he was an enthusiastic member up until the finale performance at the State Theatre in 1974. It was however not until 1967, the 35th Anniversary of the London Show that "The Angel" saw the light of day nationally, with Eddie leading it at the Golders Green Hippodrome.

Way back in 1959 I had a Stage Manager who I discovered had done some entertaining in the army during World War 11. I decided his values were being lost backstage as Stage Manager and put him into sketches. When Ralph came to see the show he invited him also into the London Gang, his name you ask? Reg Hatt!

Now both Eddie and Reg are together again in that "Happy Land"
